
Message from Editor

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Our Most Precious Possessions: Our Children PARKING LOT SAFETY AND YOU!

Fourteen years ago, a good (younger) friend of mine asked at her Condo Interview if anyone had children here, because she was going to have several. Lorraine assured her it was okay. In 1997 that first child was born here. Today I am convinced Lorraine still provides services as a Guardian Angel.

Today we can't even count all the children who live here and come strolling through the doors every afternoon. Watch the kids get off the school buses and work their way through the parking lot and into the building. There are a lot of them. The demographics have changed

through the years. Young and old, we all share a common building we call HOME: a place of refuge and safety. Parking lots can be a dangerous place not only for other cars but for children and the elderly. My intent is raising the awareness of safety.

If you look in the November issue of the Flamenco Flyer you will see an article under "Monthly Reminders" on the Speed Limit in the Parking Lot. We ask for your continued attention to observe the Parking Lot Speed Limit of 5 MPH. We have had numerous accidents and incidents in the Parking Lot in the last few years. My car is parked

near the entrance and in the past two months I have had two near misses from speeding cars. I have personally seen one of my neighbor's cars get hit by her neighbor three times. Worse yet, the neighbor didn't even know or care to say anything and denied it. Of course the police were able to match the paint and damage and reparations were made.

Parking Lots are inherently dangerous places. Insurance company's statistics indicate that nearly 25% of all reported" accidents occur in a parking lot. Why do I say reported? Like the neighbor above, over half of all park-

ing lot accidents involving a parked car are never reported. Many people will walk away from an accident if they think they can get away with it. Most parked cars will not report the incident to their owners or the police. The other reason is that in the United States 14.7% of all drivers are uninsured. In states like Florida and California that figure is closer to 22%.

Statistically, over 80% of bumper scratches occur during parking while 30% of the drivers feel it's OK to "love tap" your neighbor's car. Well, those love taps and scratches cost on aver-

age between \$400 and \$1500 to repair. We may rationalize this and say, "Well, she has insurance." Insurance companies may raise car insurance premiums up to 40% for claims, even if the victim was NOT at fault. Consequently, the majority of victims never report or file an insurance claim.

I mentioned above that the demographics are changing. Elderly drivers face many challenges. After age 70 most people experience a decline in reaction time, poor vision and cognitive skills. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports that Senior citizens comprise 9% of the population but account for 14% of traffic fatalities and 17% of pedestrian fatalities.

Drivers under age 25 are still the highest risk! Cell phone use and texting while driving have become a national safety hazard. Texting while driving is estimated to have the same risk as being nearly 3 times over the legal alcohol limit.


So how does this affect you? Remember all those kids coming home from school? Well, those are YOUR kids. Young and old, we all deserve a safe place to live. Don't take your safety and others for granted

And pedestrians, you share in this responsibility! It is all too common to see residents walking down the middle of the parking lot. Sadly, I even see a few who refuse to move over to allow cars to pass. Parents, teach your children to walk on sidewalks in those areas that have sidewalks. If no sidewalks are present, walk along the <u>side</u> of the road. Remember, after all this is a parking lot so use caution. Observe the 5MPH speed limit and stop signs.

In a safety awareness campaign I ask you not only observe and respect our Home and Community but discuss it with your family members and neighbors. Like any community violation, issues or concerns, notify desk security or the management office. Management will advise the owner/residents of any concerns and if appropriate issue a warning letter to the offender.


